About the 2025 Conference

Clinical and Scientific Program

Join scientists, researchers, and medical professionals for a two-day event highlighting the latest findings in Prader-Willi syndrome research and clinical care. Topics will include PWS genetics, molecular mechanisms, neurobiology, metabolism, therapeutic development, clinical care, and clinical trials. We anticipate that the United in Hope 2025 Clinical and Scientific meeting will be the most robust and best attended ever given the unique partnership between PWSA | USA, FPWR, and IPWSO. Professional Providers Program

Professional providers and caregivers are integral to the health and well-being of those living with PWS and it is critical they have access to the latest information. The two-day Professional Providers Program offers a variety of lectures and workshops in a collaborative space where professionals can exchange practice-driven knowledge and actively contribute their experiences. This collaboration will enhance the care provided to individuals and develop new methods of support on a range of topics like research, relationships, technology, the role of therapies, diagnostic instruments in behavior management, autonomy, aging, and more. Whether you have daily or occasional involvement as a professional caregiver of people with PWS or are in a supportive role for your country's national PWS association, we invite you to attend.

Family Program

The two-day Family Program is a powerful experience for parents, grandparents, caregivers, and professionals of people with PWS and SYS. Multiple learning tracks offer an array of topics that can be tailored to your individual preferences. It is a time to build relationships with other families, attend counseling sessions and support groups, meet with top specialists and authorities on PWS, and have fun. Experts in the field will provide attendees with up-to-date information and resources for addressing the very complex needs of supporting and caring for an individual diagnosed with PWS.

Adults with PWS Program

The upcoming program for adults living with PWS will be a remarkable gathering aimed at providing support, education, and empowerment to individuals navigating life with Prader-Willi syndrome. Throughout the event, attendees will engage in insightful discussions, attend informative sessions, and connect with peers and experts in the field. Key topics will include managing health and wellness, fostering independence, navigating relationships and social dynamics, and accessing resources and support networks. The program will provide a safe and inclusive space for adults with PWS to share their experiences, challenges, and triumphs, while also equipping them with valuable tools and strategies to enhance their quality of life.

Little Tikes Camp (0 - 24 months): (Formerly referred to as YIP Infants) The Little Tikes Camp will provide infant and toddler care to children 6-weeks to 24-months of age. During Little Tikes Camp, your loved one will be cared for by staff that have worked in either the healthcare or childcare fields. There will be a variety of age-appropriate activities, along with quiet rest times throughout the day. This camp is available to both children with and without PWS.

Junior Adventure Camp (2 - 6 years old): (Formerly referred to as YIP) The Junior Adventure Camp will provide fun and entertaining activities for children ages 2-years to 6-years of age. The volunteer staff working the Junior Adventure Camp either have a background working as care providers for individuals with PWS or as teachers. Rest assured, Junior Adventure Campers will have two fun-filled days of activities while parents attend the conference. Parents can have peace of mind knowing their little one is having fun and making new friends. This camp is available to children with and without PWS.

Adventure Camp (7 years and up): (Formerly referred to as YAP) The Adventure Camp will provide two days of fun and exciting structured activities for individuals with PWS who are seven years and older. Campers will be in groups with others their age and supported by staff that are experienced and trained in caring for individuals with PWS. Rest assured that while you are attending conference, your loved one will be having fun participating in activities that range from music and movement to building birdhouses, all while making new friends in a safe and structured two days of camp.

Sibling Camp (6 - 14 years old): The Sibling Camp will provide two fun and exciting days of activities for siblings of individuals with PWS, ages 6-years-old to 14-years-old. This camp will allow your child to participate in numerous activities, make friends with other siblings, and share their experiences. The Siblings Campers may participate in an offsite activity.
